Recap on Stewart's Tourism Season

Stewart Visitor Centre closed for the season September 15th, 2024, and will reopen in May of 2025.

This was a very busy year for the Visitor Centre, and our team of ambassadors interacted with more visitors than in the previous six years. (The time span for which we have recorded statistics through Destination BC).

9,623 visitors were recorded this year in the Visitor Centre from mid-May through to September, and they came from all around the world! The majority of our visitors came from BC and the rest of Canada, as well as from the United States and Western Europe.

Of the nearly 10,000 visitors we hosted in Stewart the top three inquiries we heard at the Visitor Centre were requests for information on the Salmon Glacier, Bear viewing and local hiking trails.

Something unique to the Stewart Visitor Centre this season was that all of the gift shop items sold in the Visitor Centre were exclusively created by local artists, photographers and artisans. The majority of the items sold were created right here in Stewart, with the furthest artisan being from Prince Rupert.

We are already busy planning for 2025 and cannot wait to welcome back visitors next year!

GRANT IN AID APPLICATIONS 2024



The District of Stewart annually receives requests for financial assistance and grants from individuals, groups, and community organizations in support of programs, services or functions that benefit the community.

These requests for financial assistance may be met through applying to the District of Stewart's Grant in Aid Program.

Effective September 1, 2024, there are amendments to the Grant in Aid Policy. The current policy can be found on the District of Stewart website, along with application forms. Application forms can also be picked up at the District of Stewart Offices at 705 Brightwell Street.

The deadline for Grant-in-Aid applications over \$1,000 is October 31st, 2024.
