# Winter Snow Clearing

Winter season is fast approaching and the District would like to take this opportunity to communicate our snow removal process, as well as requirements & recommendations that will assist us all in getting through the winter season safely.

#### **Snow Removal**

The District has classified roads based on their function, traffic volume, and importance to the welfare of the community. First priority is given to high volume routes which connect major sections of the District and provide access for emergency services.

- As per Policy OPS-006, Director of Public Works will determine when to begin snow or ice control operations.
   The criteria for that decision are:
- Snow accumulation of 10 cm or more;
- Drifting of snow that causes problems for travel;
- Icy conditions which seriously effect travel and pedestrians; and
- Time of snowfall in relationship to heavy use of streets.

#### Requirements for Snow & Ice Removal by the District, Residents, and Business Owners

■ As per Bylaw 959-2019, the District Public Works Department will initially clear the sidewalks upon accumulation of 10cm of snow, each morning.

After such time, it is the requirement of business & apartment owners to clean any snow or ice from sidewalks/footpaths adjacent to such premises upon the accumulation of no more than 10cm of snow, as well as ensure application of salt/sand product that is not detrimental to any cement/concrete surfaces, throughout the remainder of each day, between the hours of 8:00am and 8:00pm.

Business premises adjacent to a highway are required to remove from any roof, awning, marquee, projection or cornice of the premises
 all ice, icicles or snow which may fall and cause personal injury or property damage.

#### **Vehicle Parking**

 This is a reminder that as per Bylaw 995-2022, and 959-2019 parking on roads that may restrict snow clearing is prohibited.

Resource Breakfast: Focus on the Mining Industry in the Golden Triangle.

## <u>Meetings with Ministers</u>

Deputy Minister Allison Bond; Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction

DOS Request: Reinstate the funding that was previously allotted to the community for family consultant services and emphasized the need for senior housing.

Minister Josie Osborne; Minister of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation

DOS Request: Continuation of the Northwest Transmission Line further North to support potential mines and resource development.

#### Emphasized:

- Regional importance of the Causeway Bridge and requested support for its replacement.
- Thanked the Minister for the Northwest BC Resource Benefits Alliance Funding.

Minister Bowinn Ma; Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness

DOS Request: Provision of emergency funding for the District's Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Department. Emphasized:

- Outlined the large geographical area our local volunteers have to cover and that when they leave the community to attend a highway rescue that leaves the community vulnerable.
- Funding is needed for our volunteers who give so much of their time to help keep our community and region safe.

Brian Bedford, Madelaine Martin, and Josh Craig; Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure DOS Request: Highway 37A and 37 Improvements and funding for the Causeway Bridge replacement. Emphasized:

- Thanked them for the resurfacing program that has happened on a portion of Highway 37A but requested that it continue to the Border. The Highway is seeing an increase in mining-related truck traffic and increased tourist traffic.
- Discussed the safety issues related to the Highway between Stewart and Hyder and the danger of falling trees

#### BC Hydro

DOS Request: Emergency backup power, Islanding of the community with Long Lake Hydro during outages, and the need for work to be done along the highway between Stewart and Hyder to protect the hydro lines.

Response:

- Work is occurring to address the highway issues.
- BC Hydro may be willing to work with Long Lake regarding Islanding.

Ministry of Municipal Affairs Staff

DOS Request: Funding for the replacement of all 4 bridges.


